Besides technology, we have made strides in organization. Our new council president has already pushed us in running our meetings even more efficiently. This improvement is concurrent with the progress of other commissioned groups. We again thank the task force that remodeled the church office. I continue to be impressed in how attractive it looks each time I walk through the office door. Secondly, our ongoing teams continue to improve their work. The Christian Education and Youth and Family Ministry committee is meeting more frequently, is farther ahead in planning than previous years past and has some good ideas “up their sleeves”. The stewardship committee is more active than in the recent past, too. Within the year, the Befrienders have expanded their outreach to include sending out greeting cards and reading for the visually impaired.

Not only are the planning teams keeping up the momentum, but programming ministry is also keeping apace. Youth confirmation has been more enjoyable this year. The new adult class has also been a good opportunity for study. Both high school and elementary religious release were successful ventures and we had a number of participants who were not students or leaders last year join us. It has enriched our congregation to have additional Bible study opportunities at Riverview Manor and the parsonage. The youth Quake/Zone trip was again fun for all and the movie showing to fundraise the excursion was a hit. The film was very inspirational.

Third, I have heard positive comments about another impacting Holy Week. The kids enriched our service by marching around the sanctuary for Palm Sunday. We contributed a beautiful sounding choir for Good Friday in addition to the drama provided by the Assembly of God. I really enjoyed Easter with another delicious breakfast, a first-time egg hunt, and having so many kids up front for the children’s sermon. The music was also stirring with the choir performing and Justin Wilton being our guest trumpeter.

If I had to summarize the ministry of our congregation right now, I would use the symbol at the top of this article to express where we are right now. I chose such a sign because there has been progress. But I can think of two issues that

We would hate to see all these great ministries be scaled back not for lack of interest or volunteers but simply because there are not the funds behind them. **Kenya**

For three weeks this past January, I found myself adventuring in a beautiful foreign land across the Atlantic Ocean: Kenya. I was there on a short-term study abroad trip through Bethel University to study the media and the culture. Along with all the memories, photos, and new friends, I came home from Kenya with a new perspective. I've had people ask me if I experienced culture shock when I was there, but the odd thing was I think I experienced more culture shock when I returned to the states. I was seeing my world through a new set of eyes—and I honestly didn't really like it much anymore.

My world here in Minnesota is so incredibly different than the world I lived in for three weeks in Kenya, and it's still hard for me to believe that they exist on the same planet. In Kenya, poverty is huge. It's nearly everywhere you look. But within that poverty, what struck me the most is the incredible generosity of these people when they have so little to begin with.

When we were walking through Mathare slum, we visited the home of a friend of our guide, Jessica; she was introduced as Mama David. This woman lived in a one room shed-like structure, and even though Jessica had told her not to, she made food for us. This woman very likely made her money picking through the trash heaps outside of the slum, but she still wanted to give us something to eat. We couldn't bring ourselves to take anything from her, even though she offered so kindly.

Another instance of incredible generosity that I experienced was when we stayed with our host families. My travel buddy Emma and I were blessed to stay with the Mugo family, and I can hardly begin to describe how kind and hospitable they were. They always made sure we were well fed and always encouraged us to eat more food, even when we were certain we could not. Beyond asking and insisting we have more than what we need, they also said so many times just how grateful they were to have us staying with them and what a blessing we were, when it was us that were blessed by their willingness to open their home and their lives to two complete strangers.

People in Kenya live such simple lives, but out of that simplicity they are willing to give to the point of uncomfortability. So I found myself a bit bitter when I returned to my life in this nation of excess. "How do I reconcile these two completely different worlds that I've come to know?" I wondered. How do I make sense of why I'm here, while 1.2 million people are living in Kibera slum right now—now that I know that it's more than a number, now that I've seen their faces.

And honestly, I don't entirely know yet. But I do know that I take less for granted and I aspire to be as kind and giving as the beautiful people I encountered in Kenya. One other thing my eyes were opened to is that while people experiencing poverty may have less when it comes to material things or opportunities, I think they see life in a way that it is difficult to grasp when you're living comfortably. While there's more struggle, there's more potential for true joy in the Lord. And that joy manifested can be such a beautiful thing.

Meeting was called to order by President Susan Coccie at 7:00 pm. Coccie welcomed new Council member Jennifer Myles and Pastor Fiskness opened with prayer.

### AGENDA

Wayne Thom was in attendance to review a Statement of Loss from Church Mutual that outlined losses and payments made on the claim regarding the June 2012 flood. Two pumps, three or four file cabinets, tablecloths, and two brass vases still need to be purchased.

**Financial:** MOTION BY JOHNSEN, SECOND BY ZIEROTH TO APPROVE THE FINANCIAL REPORT. MOTION CARRIED.

**Youth & Family:** Pastor Carl reported Religious Release is done for this school year, the egg hunt on Easter morning was a success, recognition of graduates will be May 18, and Baccalaureate will be at Hope Lutheran on May 28. Jen Myles stated she and Carolyn Hosking will try to keep Sunday School going over the summer.

**Communication & Technology:** Jeff Kletscher presented an outline of the work he has completed for Hope Lutheran in the areas of technology, finance, and vital records and stated he is finished with the list of things the Council asked him to do. He also said the sale of the property at 119 9<sup>th</sup> Ave. E., Floodwood, is complete and the proceeds were deposited into general savings. Coccie reported she put pictures from Easter morning on Facebook and they have received many "Likes".

**Building:** Bubba Vance reported Mark Larva will make the railing for the south stairs. Pastor Fiskness said John and Nathan Seredinski are doing electrical work at the parsonage.

**Befrienders:** Will begin reading to the blind and continue to send greeting cards.

**HLCW:** The Teddy Bear Picnic will be May 4 and the proceeds will go to general savings.

**Office Remodeling:** L. Hutchinson said after the mirror above the desk is moved and the secretary's desk is secured, the remodeling will be done.

**Stewardship:** Coccie reported the committee has made a list of service opportunities for the congregation.

**Quilters:** Coccie stated 9 quilts and 1 lap robe were made last month.

**Pastor:** Pastor Fiskness distributed a printed report of his activities.
