Hope Lutheran Church Annual Meeting of the Congregation January 28, 2024

Call Meeting to Order Council President Bubba Vance called the meeting to order at 10:22 AM.

Confirmation of Quorum by Ushers: Usher confirmed a quorum was present (43).

Approval of Agenda - Motion made by Todd Messner, support by Carolyn Hosking to approve the agenda as submitted. Motion carried.

Approval of 2023 Annual Meeting Minutes – Motion made by Carolyn Hosking, support by Pat Seredinski to approve the minutes as submitted. Motion carried.

Recognition of outgoing council member – Bubba Vance was thanked for his many years of service on the Church Council.

Proposed state of Candidates for Council Position – Gary Gustafson and Carolyn Hosking are the two candidates for the two open positions on the council. (Proposed slate of candidates was included in the annual report.)

Nominations from the floor – There were NO nominations from the floor.

Motion by John Seredinski, support by Todd Messner to elect Gary Gustafson and Carolyn Hosking to a three year term (ending January 2027). Motion carried.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Burgess' report was included in the Annual Report. Pastor report that this is his 6th year and they feel that this is their family! Some of our best attendance at the Christmas program and the Lent soup suppers happened this past year. Pastor has been teaching Bible study at the Riverview Apartments the first and third Thursdays of the month and another after fellowship on Sundays.

He has also been teaching confirmation classes to two students; Lacey Wojtysiak will be confirmed this year and Lilyana Johnson next year.

Pastor continues to teach for PEG Ministries a class on pastoral care ministry in small rural congregations to new pastors who have stepped up to serve in their congregations. He has taught 3 already and is now teaching his 4th.

Prayers for 2024 to develop an increasing hunger for God's word and sacraments. We need to once again be thankful to God for all the blessings this nation has received. He will provide for us as we turn to him because he loves us so much, he is a promise keeper to those who trust him.

Presidents Report (Bubba Vance) – We are so blessed here at Hope, to have all the people that volunteer, help out, donate, and do all the things everyone does to make the church what it is. Thank you.

Treasurer's Report/ 2024 BudgetProposalandApprovalAdministratorJeffKletscherprovided a brief verbal review ofthe information included in theannual report (pages 8 - 16). TheEndowment fund balance was notin but it will be listed in the Beacon

of Hope once it comes in. Average attendance in 2023 was 40 people. Memorials are listed in the Annual Report. The Council receives budget information at every Council meeting and they are well informed and work hard to keep track of the budget and various accounts. We received \$300 from the Clothing Etc. as a donation, that will be used to offset our cost for 2024 Community VBS.

2023 General Fund Giving totaled \$83,340.20 with expenses of \$88,860.07. Jeff reviewed the proposed 2024 proposed budget (pages 17 - 19), highlighting the accounts that were changed. The Church Council approved the proposed 2024 Budget at their January 21, 2024 Council Meeting. Motion by Todd Messner, second by Elsie Tollgaard to approve the 2024 Budget as included in the Annual Report. Motion carried.

Jeff reminded the Congregation that he is always available to answer questions and the financial reports and related information are always available for anyone to review if they have questions.

Closing Comments – Hope is the people here, not the building! Come more often, make it a priority to support one another as Jesus has! Thank Jeff for all he has done!

Closing Prayer – Pastor Burgess lead the closing prayer which included a table prayer for our potluck meal.

Adjourn Meeting – President Vance declared the meeting adjourned at 10:56 AM.

Lent starts on February 14 and assuming we will meet Wednesdays for Lent soup suppers. Will be out of town on February 28, so we will need someone to be Pastor that night. 
