Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ,

We have reached August. It will soon be the end of summer and back to school days. That is in a "normal" year. This is anything but that. We have restarted church worship services, but so far, only about 50% of you are attending. I hear you, that you are concerned about catching coronavirus. It is a serious infection and we are taking recommended precautions to protect you.

Now in accordance with Governor Waltz's statewide mandatory facemask executive order for inside activities we are recommending you wear facemasks or a face shield and spread out social distancing 6 feet or more apart. If you can't wear a mask due to a pre-existing medical condition you are still welcome to attend since we have abundant room to spread out and can find a space for you to feel safe and comfortable. This mandate is to try and protect all of us during this viral pandemic. Some are concerned about singing. We have only two songs in the service. There are a few song leaders up front, a safe distance from those in the pews. You can listen only or hum along. Some are also concerned about the fact we take an attendance list. This is for our use in contacting you if someone in the service comes down with the virus. It is for your protection to know if you should have to quarantine in the event someone tests positive. As of now, we have had no cases to respond to. God is watching over us.

I know this can be a scary time but as Christians we are told not to worry. Worry comes out of fear. Peace comes out of love and trust in a God who loves us. Our God is with us and has guaranteed us a heavenly home with him. He tells us He will take care of all our needs including keeping us safe if we will seek His face, ask Him and trust Him. Let us all take the opportunity to do this together in worship again. I look forward to seeing you.

Reviewed May Financial reports. Motion by Deb Tollgaard, second by Mark Johnsen to approve the Treasurers report as submitted. Motion carried.

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report: Pastor, with help has produced recorded online Sunday morning and Wednesday midweek services for the past 3 months. They

have been well received. Special thanks to Susan Coccie, Mark, Kathy and Jeanette Johnsen, Cindy Burgess, and Jeff Kletscher for all of their help with this as well. Special thanks to all of the Hope Lutheran for making all of the facemasks that were made and to Grace, Cindy and Mark for help with drive thru communion. Pastor purchased hand bags for Mother's Day for the ladies and candy bars for the men on Father's Day. He visited with Carlene and Sulo Jatkola, gave them face masks, Mother's day bag and they enjoy the online services which helps them stay connected with us in Floodwood. Pastor has also been putting out prayers each week for use by members to help them establish daily prayer time and he eagerly look forward to restarting church services together again.

Administrator's Report

Report was provided in packet, it included general checking deposit on June 9, \$1895.00. 125 produce boxes were given away in less then 2 hours. Thank you to all of the volunteers.

Committee Reports

Building Committee – Tree removal: Greg Schminski looked at the tree and said he would only charge \$25 to cut it down. Terry Heikkila and others will need to help hall away and clean up the site. <u>Quilting</u> – Ladies have been making face masks. They are also finishing up some additional quilts. Quilts will be donated to Salvation Army in Duluth.

Old Business

- a. Rental Update Jeff spoke with the Lampings. Lampings wanted the church to sell them the land and the garage. Discussion held on next steps, it was very clear that we do not want to sell "any part of the lot". Suggestion to sell the garage only to Lamping's for \$250 as long as they remove it from the lot by August 1, 2020. Otherwise it would be demolished along with the house if Congregation approves the demo at congregational meeting. Motion made by Dean Fries, second by Bubba Vance sell garage to the Lampings for \$250 if removed by August 1, 2020. Motion carried.

Q & A SESSION WITH JEFF

Q: Jeff, why is the church keeping track of attendance each Sunday.

A: One of the recommendations of our insurance company before reopening was the keep a log/list of those who attend. (Most other resources also encouraged keeping the log/list.) It is kept in case there is a case of COVID-19 in someone who attended Church – think use for contract tracing. That way we know who to contact so they can be told about their exposure. This would be similar to going out to a restaurant to eat, most will require your contact information in case of a COVID-19 exposure at the restaurant in the time period you at there.

Q: Jeff, what do you do with the lists? Do you share them?

A: The log/list is kept in the church office, they are not shared with anyone. They are kept in a box along with a copy of the slideshow we project on the screen. They only time they would be shared would be if we have a COVID-19 case among those who attend Sunday Service and the St. Louis County Health Department or Minnesota Department of Health needs information for contact tracing.
