S eason's Greetings for a Blessed Advent and Christmas,

When I look out of my window and see the snow, I know that means Christmas is coming soon. We have just finished celebrating Thanksgiving in an unusual manner for many of us this year with no large family gatherings or travel because of the COVID pandemic. Our political leaders encouraged us to stay home and limit our contact with other people. If that is what lies ahead, it just doesn't seem like Christmas. This Advent how are we to prepare?

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report: He baptized two of Hazel Bailey's great grandchildren, held a

funeral for Jay Kadin and gave communion to two shut ins. Great response with kids a Religious release, 14 in elementary and 7 in high school. Big thank you to Cindy, Grace, and Jan for providing treats and Rob, Tim, Deb and Hazel for helping. LCMC churches have seen a similar drop in attendance do to COVID. They are showing trends in younger generations where Gen-X and Gen-Z prefer online church. Even 20% to 30% of Millennial's say they prefer on-line worship. Pastor states he has been teaching a Bible study on Goliath Must Fall, it gives helpful suggestions on how to deal with the giants of fear, rejections, comfort, anger, and addictions in our lives. A prayer vigil for the election will be Nov 1st at 6:00 p.m. hosted by the local Pastoral group. This will be to pray for a peaceful time and that God's will be served. December 18 there will be a community dinner at the Event Center sponsored by the Pastoral Group, more to come later.

It is in times like this we need to know His promise to us as outlined in Psalm 91, also known as the rescue scripture. It begins with these words, "He that dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty." This means that we are to stay close to God in our lives. It is not the time to go outside the will of God. The world around us is panicking and wondering what to do, buying toilet paper and hand sanitizer like there is no tomorrow, living like they don't really care about others in this world. We however, must be steadfast on and in His Word. We cannot be wavering with uncertainty deceived by news reports, whether they are true or false., but we must dwell and abide in the steadfast secret place of the Most High. Are you asking where is the secret place? The secret place is in the Hand of God.

Psalm 91 goes on to say in verse 3, "surely, he shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler and from the noisome pestilence." The word noisome pestilence means calamity and ruin. That is exactly what the COVID-19 is doing, it is spreading rapidly trying to ruin our normal way of living leaving calamity, fear and panic as it spreads over the entire planet. But God promises us that if we stay in His Hands, we can have the peace that passes all understanding. No more fear and uncertainty.

Psalm 91 vs.9-16 talks about the promises that we who dwell in the secret place have. These verses say, "Because thou hast made the Lord, which is my refuge, they habitation; there shall no evil befall thee, neither shall any plague come nigh thy dwelling. For he shall give his angels charge over thee, to keep thee in all thy ways."

There are some great promises here, but it requires that we stay in His Hands. This Advent, as we prepare for the birth of Jesus and celebrate the coming of His Hands, we need to be encouraged and not despair in the difficult times we are living in now. We need to understand that Jesus has a name above all names and COVID-19. coronavirus. or whatever other name there is out there, has to bow down to the name of Jesus. So, although the times ahead are uncertain, although some states have shut down, although some churches have had to cancel services, we can be assured that at the name of Jesus this pandemic has to cease. At the name of Jesus even demons have to flee. There is nothing that can stand against us when we call on His Great Name, Jesus. Jesus precious Savior in you we have the victory!
