Pastor John opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:01 AM by Bubba Vance.

Approval of Agenda

Motion made by Tanya Johnson, second by Mark Johnsen to approve the agenda as submitted. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

Pastor's Report

Pastor Burgess reported 80 miles and 12 Communions given. Teaching Pastors from Calvary Lutheran Orr, Minnesota. Pastor is teaching Bible study at the apartments on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of the month and teaching from the book of Romans. Hope singers and Pastor sang Christmas carols on Christmas Shopping Floodwood night. A Community Christmas Service will be held on Friday, January 13 at the Event Center again this year. Each church contributes \$250. Last

year Pastor and Dave Bolstad did a drama/skit and Pastor hopes others will help this year. The Children's Christmas program will be Sunday, December 18. There will be a Christmas Eve service and a Christmas Day service, and January 1st will be a Service of Lessons and Carols. Hope Lutheran will host the Community Christmas Dinner on Sunday, December 25 from Noon to 1:30 at the Downtown Fair PM Building.

Treasurers Report and Administrator's Report

The fund for Religious Release for snacks account is \$254.89. HLCW donated \$1080 from pie sales (General Checking). The quarterly inspection on elevator completed and all is good. Mr. Kletscher will spend Christmas Eve and Christmas day with his family. Dave Bolstad will run the computer. We received a Thank You and a check from John Hayes. He deer hunts each year in our area and required the WiFi and our space to lead his Church Council meeting in Colorado. Kletscher assisted him with this. Youth account has \$4,279.33 in checking and \$297.67 in savings. Endowment report for the year is in the report.
