Hope Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes October 26, 2025 (Approved January 18, 2026)

Members Present

Gary Gustafson, Missy Wojtysiak, Jan Dornseif, Pat Seredinski, Kim Hutchinson, Pastor Burgess and Administrator Jeff Kletscher. Absent Carolyn Hosking, Guest Lacey Wojtysiak

Meeting was called to order at 8:00 AM by Gary Gustafson.

Pastor Burgess opened with prayer.

Approval of Agenda

Motion by Missy Wojtysiak, second by Kim Hutchinson to approve agenda as submitted. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

July 27th, 2025 Church Council minutes in packet. Motion to approve by Kim Hutchinson, second by Pat Seredinski. Motion carried.

President's Report

We did indeed go to Young Life in Cloquet and they are very nice. They do fun things like games, skits, sing songs/play guitar and then a bible lesson. It is in an old school, so there is also a gym for the kids to utilize. I did get more information from Brian. More informative regarding getting staff, etc. We would really like to move forward, also discuss with other

local pastors. Lacey had a lot of fun, took a little bit to engage but then really enjoyed it. There are 3 different groups that meet separately, Elementary, Middle School and High school.

Discussion regarding policy on armed parishioners.

Pastor's Report

This month's mileage was 199 miles, with three communions given. The funeral for Ethel Pensak was completed, along with the final burial ceremony for Doug and Hazel Bailey, attended by the Honor Guard. I'm teaching two pastors a ten-week PEG ministries course in pastoral care, two hours each week—Jeff will wrap up this Thursday, and the other pastor will finish in 5–6 weeks. I'm also leading Bible studies twice a month on Thursdays at Riverview Apartments, teaching an adult Bible class every Sunday, and working with High School and Elementary students in religious release each week. There are no confirmation students this year. Advent begins November 30th, we'll also decorate the church for Christmas that day. Cindy and I will be in town for Thanksgiving.

Treasurers Report and Administrator's Report

July, August and September check registers, Financial Report and Summarized Financial Report included and reviewed, nothing unexpected noted. Sam's Club Credit Card issue – payment dispute was resolved. Have been informed there will be a Community Christmas Dinner this year. Private wedding on 9/20/25 went off with no issues, donation was made and placed in General Fund Offering. New eternal Sanctuary Lamp has arrived,

electric. Will be wall mounted, cost was \$384.99, purchased from Concordia Publishing-waiting for bill, funds will be from Memorial Savings. Waiting for wall mount to be installed. September Globe offering for Religious Release snacks \$378. Religious Release snack fund \$632.89 (held in Missions Checking). CCLI Reporting period 10/1/25-3/31/26: every song or video we play in church. We pay a yearly fee and this reporting period has to do with royalties paid. Fire Extinguisher testing completed on 9/30/25—they met with John S-no issues. Elevator Inspection on 10/8/25-ok, no issues. Several letters to City of Floodwood regarding Lead Waterlines. They hired consultants to evaluate. Jeff wrote letters regarding the parking lot and vacant lot and met with the consultants. Insurance premiums increased to \$12,245.34 per year (from \$11529.00). Snow removal contract with FST for 2025-2026 completed. CDs up slightly. Endowment fund is doing well.

Motion by Jan Dornseif, second by Kim Hutchinson to approve the reports as submitted. Motion carried.

Committee Reports

Christian Education and Youth: Included in Pastor's and Administrator's reports. Quake event will be March 20-22. Lacey, Kendra, Lilyana, and Allie are registered. Tanya and Summer will be chaperones. Bill paid in full \$1334.00

Old Business

- a. Roof Update – 10/8/25 (Jeff) – They have indicated they will replace the entire roof next spring. Tamco is not backing their shingles so PEAK Roofing will cover the cost.
- b. Sump Pump – Dave is working on it; he adjusted it during pie making.

New Business

- a. Minnesota Paid Leave Act Update and Discussion – Paid leave is covered by premiums paid by employers and employees. The standard premium for small businesses is 0.66%. The employer must pay at least 0.22% and employee up to 0.44%. Jeff proposes a 0.33%/0.33% split. Motion made by Kim Hutchinson, second by Missy Wojtysiak. Motion carried.
- b. Budget Discussion (increase Pastor's Pay) – Pastor is currently receiving the same salary of \$36,000/year as when he started on September 2, 2018. Suggested pay increase of 10% to become

effective on November 1, 2025. Motion made by Kim Hutchinson, second by Jan Dornseif. Motion carried.

c. Youth Christmas Program – December 14th

d. Annual Meeting – Be thinking of dates and candidates for Council Positions. Council Positions to be filled in 2026 – Missy and Jan's seats (Jan is currently completing a 1-year term and is eligible for another term, Missy is not eligible for another term). Annual Meeting report due – Jan 11th, Council Meeting date – Jan 18th, Annual meeting and potluck - Jan 25th


