Pastor John Burgess opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:07 AM by Mark Johnsen.

Approval of Agenda

Motion by Deb Tollgaard, second by Bubba Vance to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

February Council Minutes - Motion by Dean Fries, second by Deb Tollgaard to approve minutes as submitted. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report

Reviewed January Financial report. Motion by Tanya Johnson, second by Bubba Vance to approve the Treasurers report as submitted. Motion carried.

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report; He has continued seeing people in nursing homes, Religious release students have been sending cards to those in nursing homes. Will be starting mid-week Lenten Services with drama series, "Will you Betray Me." Hope is hosting the Good Friday services. Funeral for Jay Kadin will be April 18.

Administrator's Report

Report was provided in packet, it included in financial report; still waiting on one deposit. Youth account has \$2,545.06. Elevator Company was out to evaluate the elevator issues, and it took two people, and four hours to find the issue (circuit board). It is fixed now.

Committee Reports

Christian Education and Youth – Minneapolis Quake event will be this Friday, Tanya Johnson will chaperon 5 of our youth. Begin figuring out who will go to Camp Patmos this summer. Develop criteria for who is allowed to go to camp, confirmation, Religious Release and Sunday school report to all be doing well.

Outreach Committee – Hope Lutheran is too small to host our own trip to The Ark and the Christian Museum. Will have to watch to see when Happy Trails Tour Company plans a trip there.

<u>Building Committee</u> – Basement furnace needed servicing from Floodwood Gas Company. John Seredinski changed the air filters.

<u>Quilting</u> – They have begun working on quilts.

Old Business

Employee a. Evaluation and Salary review - Mark Johnsen changed the **Pastor** evaluation to accommodate the needs Hope Lutheran of church. Motion by Missy Wojtysiak, second by Tanya Johnson to accept the evaluation and adapt it as needed next year and it will be Hope's evaluation on the Pastor. Motion carried. Dean Fries and Bubba Vance volunteered to review Pastors evaluation and present their findings to the council for review.

- c. Salary Review: Custodian requested salary be raised to \$12 an hour. Motion by Bubba Vance, second by Dean Fries to accept the request and grant the \$2 raise to the Custodian. Motion carried.
- d. Rental update: Administrator Kletscher said a letter was mailed to Roy Marlow and

Doug Bailey to ask for an official written bid for demolition, they did not respond. Next step is to make a final be proposal/plan to presented to the Congregation at Special Congregational meeting.

New Business

- a. Lunch after Good Friday services The Council will make a request to the HLCW to officially ask them to prepare and serve snacks and refreshments before the Good Friday service.
- Dishwasher b. purchase for the parsonage – Motion by Tanya Johnson, second by Missy Woitysiak to allow up to \$500 for the purchase of a dish washer for parsonage with the funds to be taken from the Memorial Savings account. Motion carried. John Seredinski and Bubba Vance will install.
- c. 2019 Financial Audit Check to see if Kathy Johnsen and Tim Tollgaard will do the audit again this year.

Pastor Burgess closed with prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 9:03 am.
