Treasurers Report and Administrator's Report

Paper work was filed with MN Power for LED bulbs and LED tubes that were replaced, \$303.78 was spent for 20 screw in bulbs and 64 tubes. There should be a \$168.00 rebate amount for these. Workman's Comp Audit for 7/1/22 to 7/1/23 is completed. Camp Patmos Globe offering \$395.57. Ekka support Globe offering

\$827.70, plus \$200 was given for pulpit supply and mileage. Tim Tollgaard and Kathy Johnsen agreed to do the 2022 Audit, waiting on them to complete it. CCLI Audit Reporting Period – April 1 to September 30. No change in RR snack fund. Packet included May, June, and July check registers. Updated financial statement, account balances, youth account report, and endowment report. Endowment balance on 6/30/23 was \$97,569.70.
