September 27, 2020 (Approved)

Pastor John Burgess opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:03 AM by Mark Johnsen.

Approval of Agenda

Motion by Bubba Vance, second by Deb Tollgaard to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

August 16 Council Minutes - Motion by Deb Tollgaard, second by LuAnn Heikkila to approve minutes. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report

Reviewed, no changes. Motion Bubba Vance, second by Tanya Johnson to approve the Treasurers report as submitted. Motion carried,

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report: Pastor met with the LCMC

Pastors on a Zoom meeting and discussed what they are all seeing in all of their churches, drop in attendance, and offering down about 50%. Pastor has asked that the Council members to set an example and reassure members that our members that we are taking safety seriously, and have a safe place to worship. Our Church and others in Floodwood. participated in the National Day of Prayer March, 50 Christians marched through Floodwood. praying for our education system, the clinic, praying to make this election year a time of peace and to pray that our Nation to turns back to God. The local Pastors set up an account at Northview Bank for VBS. Less than 10 children attended this year due to COVID-19, so the materials will be used again next year. Which means a large amount of money will not be needed for next year. Pastor will be hosting a Bible study after church for the next 6 weeks on Goliath Must Fall.

Administrator's Report

Report was provided in packet, Religious Release snack fund is \$71.41. A check was sent to The Life House for \$426.25 from Missions checking from the Souper Bowl of Caring. The youth were unable to bring it to the Life House do to COVID. Hope Lutheran is NO longer the fiscal agent for VBS, check (\$718.94) sent to Steve Ario so they can open own account. Certified mail was sent to St. Louis County Assessor to inform them that the rental house and garage have been demolished and to not charge us for the solid waste fee on the parcel. The insurance on the rental property was canceled the day of the demo.

Committee Reports

Christian Education and Youth -This Wednesday Religious Release time will start. Jeff ordered masks in case kids forget theirs. Juice boxes and treats in plastic bags will be used. They are hoping to find someone else to assist with the elementary kids for more help is needed. Sunday School will start next Sunday. Discussion on a Youth Fundraiser, drive -thru meal car hop and bake goods sale. Motion made by Dean Fries, second by Tanya Johnson to allow youth to conduct the fundraiser. Motion carried.

Roof Shingle de-lamination – called Peaking Roofing and Tamko to determine the process of fixing the shingles on the Church roof. We do have extra bundles of shingles which will help.

David Zieroth will remove dead tree on rental property once the ground is frozen.
