Pastor John Burgess opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:03 AM by Mark Johnsen.

#### **Approval of Agenda**

Motion by Tanya Johnson, second by Deb Tollgaard to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

#### **Secretaries Report**

July 19 Council Minutes - Motion by LuAnn Heikkila, second by Bubba Vance to approve minutes. Motion carried.

July 19 Special Congregational Meeting – Motion by Bubba Vance, second by Deb Tollgaard. Motion carried.

#### **Treasurers Report**

Reviewed, no changes. Motion by Tanya Johnson, second by Bubba Vance to approve the Treasures report as submitted. Motion carried.

#### **Pastors Report**

Pastor Burgess provided a written report: Pastor reported 74 miles traveled and 8 communions given. Still no word from school on possible religious release. Pastor and Hazel recommend focusing on Sunday school only. A high of 32 attendees at Sunday worship, but numbers are still down. Pastor is contemplating starting a Bible class, in September, entitled 'Goliath Falls'. During the July 19 service Pastor intended to share the damage done to the LCMC church in Oregon and recent mandates against churches in California. He planned to inform the church about the Anti-God sediment that is spreading across America.

#### Administrator's Report

Report was provided in packet. The Endowment fund is up about \$9,000. There was a large donation that brought our general checking fund up. There was no changes in the Religious release fund or community **VBS** fund. Mr. Kletscher reports that due to generous donations and regular contributions of offerings, Hope Lutheran Church is faring well, at this time, even during these difficult times.

#### **Committee Reports**

Christian Education and Youth – Some of the churches in the community held VBS July 27-31. But they shut down early after 3 days due to a Covid-19 outbreak in Floodwood. Hope Lutheran Church did not participate due to the concern over Covid 19.

<u>Outreach Committee</u> – No report.

Building Committee — Shrub removal at south end of parking lot — David Z will remove. Gopher One call is completed. Quilting — No report.

#### **Old Business**




As with many of you, Zoom has become the medium of mission and ministry for us. We teach students, mentor a group of young leaders and organize meetings with ministry partners.




Our students were part of "Neighborhood Kitchen" ministry to feed migrant workers as they returned to their village after India relaxed lock down. Please read this story in attached doc.

We would like to invite you to WMPL Annual Day of Prayer. This event is a prayer event we call prayer-praxis that emphasizes transforming prayer-model for interceding on behalf of people group. This model of prayer is Spirit led, Scripture fed and worship based with five different movements that include Reverence (Who is God?); Response (How should I respond? Confession and Absolution); Request (Intercession on behalf of the Korwa people; Standing in the Gap for Korwa people); Readiness (What should I do for further engagement in this regard and Doxology (Reverence). For each movement there would be teaching for a few minutes followed by small group prayer keeping the same focus. Please let us know if you would like to join in this event we will send you the link.

#### **Prayer Points:**

- Praise God for God's provision and new ways to do mission and ministry during this uncertain time.
- Praise God for many prayer partners upholding us and God's mission during this time.
- Praise God for Urbas' high school graduation and college admission.
- Pray for the students in Ranchi who are doing online classes in spite of many challenges. Pray that they will bring hope and encouragement to their communities as they are also engaged in ministry.

#### IN THE NAME OF JESUS... Neeraj and Nijhar Ekka, USA & India

During the COVID-19 pandemic, like many other countries when India suddenly imposed nationwide lockdown, this country with a population of 1.3 billion people came to a screeching halt. Millions of people were stranded in many places. Among the worst affected were migrant workers, who suddenly found themselves robbed of their only means of livelihood. For weeks they survived somehow, and when the lockdown was relaxed a bit, millions of migrants used any means possible to return to their villages. Many trains and buses arranged by the government were not enough for people returning mainly from big cities in the

southern and western parts of India. Thus, some found delivery trucks to get to a certain point, and then they walked. Some rode their bicycles for thousands of miles; many others simply walked day and night for hundreds of miles.

As migrant workers – men, women and children – started pouring into Ranchi, some women in the outskirts of the city were curiously looking at them. These women were members of a local Lutheran church. They saw hungry, thirsty, scared and desperate people and families walking on the highway to their villages. Soon something happened. They felt a surge of compassion and three of them thought of the same thing: providing a meal for these people. When they collected food materials from different homes, they had 13-14 kilos of rice, a few kilos of dal (lentils), and some vegetables. In front of them were hundreds of desperate people walking away hungry and thirsty.

Soon these women started cooking rice, lentils and vegetables. Some students from Ranchi Seminary joined their effort and mobilized prayer and resources for this ministry. Before long, other men, women and young adults from the church and community also came along to be part of this service to the hungry and thirsty in the name of Jesus Christ. Seeing this selfless service, the government officials invited the group to go to bus stands and railway stations to provide food for the migrant workers. Though the government was providing dry food such as bread, buns (a kind of fluffy bread), and fruits like bananas, etc., not all of the migrant workers received them. Since these people had not eaten a hot meal for weeks, they were overwhelmed to receive hot rice, dal and vegetables. Not only did these servants of Christ provide hot meals, they also helped to arrange transportation for many.

The Neighborhood Kitchen for migrant workers continued for 12 days. During this time the group received enough donations from ordinary believers, and even from non-believers, to provide hot meals and safe drinking water to more than 15,000 migrant workers. In addition, they also packed food for their onward journey. They also distributed several hundred masks, soaps and sanitary napkins.

While they served they remembered what Jesus said in Matthew 25:35, "When I was hungry you gave me food, and when I was thirsty you gave me water..." and they felt blessed to be part of the ministry of the Neighborhood Kitchen.

This ministry was covered with prayer from beginning to end. We also had opportunities at the Prayer League to join them in prayer. We praise God for, as one leader of this ministry said, "God's Church has left the building to come to the people in the street."
