August 22, 2021

Members Present

Pastor John Burgess opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:06 AM by Bubba Vance.

Approval of Agenda

Motion made by Tanya Johnson, second by Missy Wojtysiak to approve the agenda as submitted. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

June 13, 2021 Church Council minutes, in packet. Motion to approve by Mark Johnsen, second by Bubba Vance. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report and Administrator's Report

Expenses were higher in June due to insurance quarterly payment. There will be an increase in bills in August, as Mr. Kletscher will be purchasing a bunch of stamps before the price increase. The budget report is going as it normally does. The ELCA Endowment fund is now at \$100,912.19 we haven't seen these

numbers this high since 2006. Natural Gas Company replaced the meter, small leak found at the boiler. It was repaired. Elevator inspection in June reported all was good, then issues a few days later. It was an unplugged cable. They repaired it. Twelve (12) graduation cards were mailed out individuals who were involved with Hope at some point. Workman's comp audit completed in July for 7/1/20 to 7/1/21. An application was completed for **Property** Tax Exemption for the Parsonage. Church Mutual who provides the insurance for the church, is looking to realign and change their ownership model/corporate structure. This may cause us to look for other insurance in the future. Total Global Offering for Souper Bowl of Caring (Life House of Duluth) equals \$381.88. Mr. Kletscher states that he thinks we should receive one more qualified distribution and it should help keep finances in order.

Motion by Mark Johnsen, second by LuAnn Heikkila to approve the financial reports and Administrator's report as submitted. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Burgess reported 196 miles for June and July. Pastor will be taking over Pastor Heather Ostern's bible class at the apartments on the first and third Thursday of each month. Hope Lutheran will serve ice cream at the School's Open House night on September 2, 4 to 6 PM. Religious release will be starting Wednesdays later in the month. Grace will meet with the women to determine how best to continue with treats after Sunday Service. The outreach/evangelism

workshop in Birchwood, WI was canceled. Pastor and Cindy will be going to the LCMC National Gathering in Columbus Ohio in October. Pastor would like to start an adult Bible study focused on prophecy in the bible. Pastor will be gone Sept 6-10 to visit his son in Wisconsin.

Christian Education and Youth: Camp Patmos, the kids who went said they had a wonderful time and can't wait to go again. Feed Sack demonstration, Koochiching County fair, was a great event. Girls earned \$1,200 towards the youth account and our demonstrations were well received. Religious release begins in end of September.


