Pastor's Corner

Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ. It is September and the beginning of the fall season. Traditionally, it is a time when we adjust from a summertime of vacations and rest and we look forward to a return to school and more normal life. This year it is certainly not a return to the normal we knew before all the COVID-19 changes affected our lives.

I remember that September used to mean back to church month. It was a time when members and friends we had not seen over the summer returned to church, excited to start worship again and renewed their study of God's Word. It would be a time to renew friendships with other members and look forward to serving in the activities of God's Church. How will it be this year?

Studies done by Pew Research have shown that since the churches have reopened nationally, only about 50% of members have returned to participate in church services. Even at Hope Lutheran we have only seen average weekly attendance of about 28 since we started back. Nationally over 65% of churches have seen a significant drop in financial giving. Fortunately, we at Hope have not seen a large drop in giving but I would like to encourage all members to remember that God's blessings and the work of His church continues even during this viral pandemic. Don't forget to remember God calls us to be faithful stewards of all that He gives us so that we can be a blessing to others.

Members Present:

Tanya Johnson, Deb Tollgaard, Mark Johnsen, LuAnn Heikkila, Bubba Vance, Pastor John Burgess, Administrator Jeff Kletscher. Absent: Dean Fries and Missy Wojtysiak.

Pastor John Burgess opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:02 AM by Mark Johnsen.

Approval of Agenda

Motion by Bubba Vance, second by Deb Tollgaard to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

June Council Minutes - Motion by Bubba Vance, second by Deb Tollgaard to approve minutes as submitted. Motion carried.

Treasurers Report

Reviewed June 2020 Financial reports. Motion by Tanya Johnson, second by Bubba Vance to approve the Treasurers report as submitted. Motion carried.

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report: Pastor reported that 23 - 29 people have been attending services since the church reopened. People reported the biggest reasons for not coming was due to the coronavirus,

not wanting to wear a mask, keeping a log of attendees, or not being able to sing. Mileage for June is 74 miles. Communion given was 7. Met with LCMC pastors July 14. Continue to contact those in nursing homes once a month and hold communion twice a month with prepackaged communion cups. In June and July, Mr. Kletscher arranged for food giveaways in the church parking lot. There will be another one in August. Pastor will not be attending the LCMC Convocation in October in person, but will attend on-line for when the new service coordinator will be installed.

Administrator's Report

Report was provided in packet, it included a check for Summit Companies which was for the annual fire extinguisher testing, filling or replacing.

Committee Reports

<u>Christian Education and Youth</u> – Some of the churches in the community will hold VBS July 27-31. Hope Lutheran Church will not participate due to the concern over Covid.

Outreach Committee - No report

<u>Building Committee</u> – Tree removal at Parsonage completed. Shrubs at the south end of parking will be added into the demo of the rental house.

<u>Quilting</u> – The quilts were blessed and delivered to the Salvation Army in Duluth.
